Marmot Basin Cirque is above the tree line, with bowls and chutes never before accessible to the public. It offers some of the best high alpine terrain, fantastic skiing and snowboarding with 125 m-200m fall line runs from 25 to 45 degrees in angle for those with a thirst for off-piste, adrenaline-fueled skiing and riding; to reach the highest alpine terrain requires a hike, and your clients can also traverse the lower portions of the Cirque by exiting the Knob chair to skiers right.

UPLIFT! JASPER MURAL FESTIVAL

The New Landscape in Downtown Jasper

Jasper Mural Festival brought four talented and internationally recognized muralists to the northern Rockies to transform four back-alleys into world-class pieces of art to accentuate the natural beauty of Jasper National Park, and provide a platform for diverse cultures to share their experiences, showcase values which the community holds dear, and create a new year-round tourism draw for Jasper.

PARKS CANADA UPDATE Jasper Indigenous Exhibit

The exhibit at Athabasca Park will include landscaping, walkways, furniture, lighting, artwork and a bronze sculpture. The focus of the exhibit content includes creating a space for Indigenous Partners to communicate their connection to the area with park visitors. The exhibit will also recognize the forced removal and exclusion of Indigenous Peoples from the land that became Jasper National Park. Parks Canada is planning to host the grand exhibit opening ceremony on September 30, 2023.

Biking in Jasper

Visitors are encouraged to "BYOB" (Bring Your Own Bike or rent one) and leave their vehicles behind. From Whistlers and Wapiti Campground's a family friendly connector trail is just a short 20-minute bike ride to the townsite, and also connects to popular day-use-areas such as Lake Edith and Lake Annette and Maligne Canyon.

Food Trucks

In summer 2023, an exciting offering at Whistlers Campground...food trucks! The Bear's Paw Espresso serves delicious treats and coffee to campers throughout the day, and Tres Marias serves Mexican food.

MUNICIPALITY OF JASPER UPDATE Public Transit system

The new transit service will provide year-round service with separate summer and winter schedules running seven days a week. In the summer, a bus would run ten times a day, travelling a route that includes the main townsite. Jasper

travelling a route that includes the main townsite, Jasper Park Lodge, the Wapiti and Whistler campgrounds, and Pyramid Lake. Each round trip is proposed to take about 75 minutes. The winter schedule from mid-October to mid-May would omit the two campgrounds and run on a different frequency.

Paid Parking: From May 1 to Oct 31 annually

The 2023 rates are \$3.50 an hour on-street, and \$2.50 an hour or \$15 a day in parking lots. Payment can be made by scanning the QR code on signs, using a payment kiosk; or downloading the HotSpot app.
