Indigenous Heli Tours

This is an exclusive journey with Jasper-Hinton Air and Lauren Moberly, a Rocky Mountain Cree woman and a member of the Aseniwuche Winewak Nation of Canada. The tour begins with a scenic helicopter tour, Lauren's ancestral tales, tracing her family's path from 1909, a view of her historic homestead from an aerial perspective, and traditional bannock snacks. Tour options: 1 or 2-hour flight, total duration approx. 4 hrs. Max 5 passengers, combined weight limit 500lbs. Available year-round.

They'll take in panoramic viewpoints, stroll along white-sand beaches, dip their feet in turquoise lakes, and spot wildlife like elk and bears. PARKS CANADA UPDATE

New Exhibit at the Glacier Gallery

In support of the 2025 United Nation International Year of Glaciers' Preservation, Parks Canada will offer special programming at the Columbia Icefield. On-site interpreters will highlight the importance of glaciers and watersheds. A new exhibit, in partnership with Guardians of the Ice, will open at the Glacier Gallery, celebrating the beauty and significance of glacial ecosystems.

2025 Interpretive Programs

Jasper National Park offers a variety of free interpretive programs, including interactive sessions at Whistlers Campground Theatre and Firehall. Visitors can learn about the ecological impacts of the Jasper Wildfire with onsite interpreters and experience Indigenous-led programs that share cultural teachings and perspectives directly on the land, enriching their understanding of the region. Indigenous Exhibit is open to the public

The Jasper Indigenous Exhibit, located in Athabasca Park near the Visitor Centre, showcases a powerful collaboration between Indigenous partners and Parks Canada. Featuring a bronze eagle sculpture and traditional beadwork, the exhibit shares stories from six Indigenous languages and communities. Designed through extensive collaboration, it features a blend of community and artist panels, sharing the diverse stories and deep connections Indigenous communities have with Jasper.

MUNICIPALITY OF JASPER UPDATE

Public Transit in Jasper

Year-round public transit in Jasper. The regular fare schedule is \$2.50 for single use or \$7.00 for a day pass, and 10-use passes, as well as month passes, are available. There will also be different routes and schedules depending on the season (Summer, Fall, Winter, Spring). Jasper Transit route maps and schedules

Paid Parking: From May 1 to October 31 annually

The rates are \$4.50 an hour on-street, and \$3.50 an hour or \$17 a day in parking lots. Payment can be made by scanning the QR code on signs, using a payment kiosk, or downloading the HotSpot app. Learn more.
