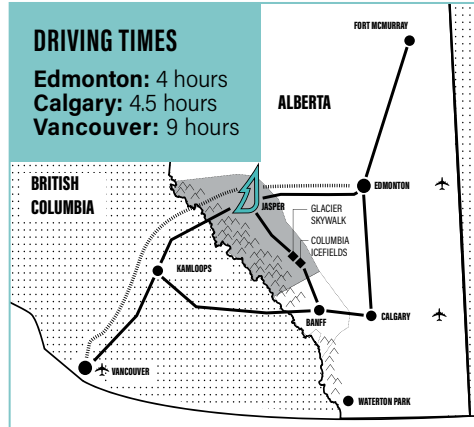

DRIVING TO JASPER

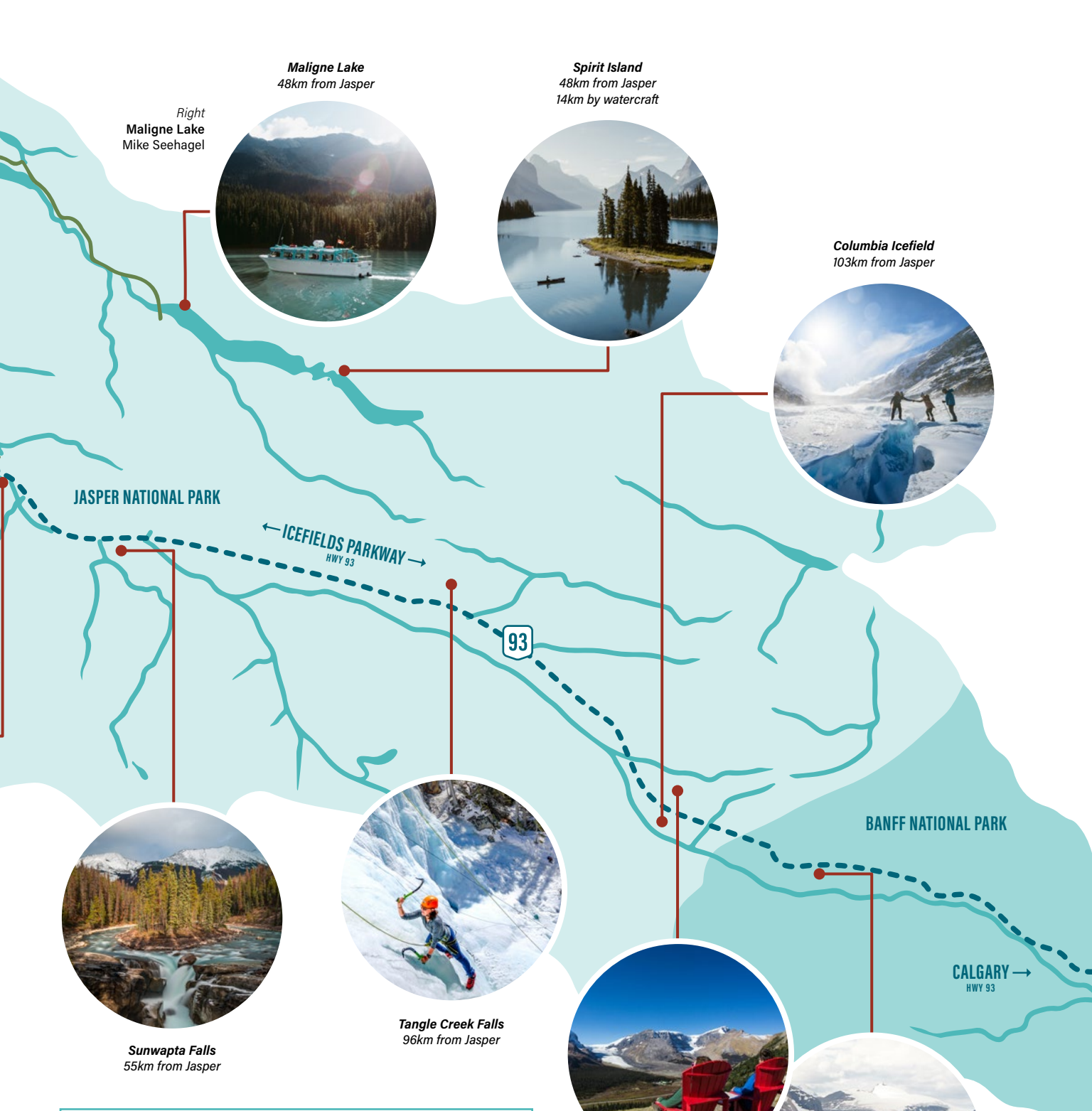
Highway 16, also known as “The Yellowhead,” is the main east-west route through Jasper and is part of the famous Trans-Canada Highway. The Icefields Parkway (Hwy 93N) runs north-south and is considered one of the most scenic drives in the world. Plan your journey to Jasper at jasper.travel/getting-here.

Road-trippers should factor in extra time for scenic stops, wildlife slowdowns and/or weather changes. Or, let a professional take the wheel and book an airport shuttle, transport bus, or private charter tour with SunDog Transportation and Tour Co. (p.29). With service to Edmonton, Calgary, Banff and many places in-between, this homegrown business prides itself on quality service and thoughtful details like hotel pick-ups and large windows well-suited to sightseeing and taking photos. The Edmonton and Mountain Connector buses also have onboard Wi-Fi.



5 TIPS FOR DRIVING THE ICEFIELDS PARKWAY IN WINTER

- 1 Confirm conditions**
Weather is often different on the parkway than surrounding areas. Check road reports at 511.alberta.ca.
- 2 Fill up before leaving**
There is nowhere to get gas between Jasper and Lake Louise in winter. Electric vehicle drivers should note Jasper's two charging stations.
- 3 Watch for wildlife**
The parkway passes through caribou habitat. Be alert, drive the speed limit, and keep multiple bus-lengths of distance from any animals.
- 4 Bring supplies**
Much of the highway has no cellphone reception. Have an emergency kit that includes extra warm clothing, food, and water.
- 5 Snow Tires**
Snow tires are mandatory from November through March. Finally, leave early with plenty of time to fully enjoy the views along the route!

**GET INTO JASPER
FASTER. BUY YOUR

In 2026, the Park Pass is required to enter the national park from Jan. 16 to Jun. 18, and from Sept. 8 to Dec. 31. It can be used at all national parks and national historic sites in Canada. You must print the Park Pass *before* arriving.

THE ECOLOGY OF FIRE: REBIRTH AND RENEWAL IN THE NATIONAL PARK

If you're visiting Jasper National Park this summer, you might be surprised to see seas of pinkish purple blooms lighting up the landscape. Those beautiful flowers are called fireweed — and are just one part of a natural process of regeneration that takes place after a wildfire.

Note: Parks Canada works very hard to ensure visitor safety. It's especially important in the post-fire landscape to stay on trails and out of any restricted areas, both for your own safety and that of the land.

"The narrative has been that fire can be quite damaging," says Parks Canada Fire and Vegetation Specialist Charlie McLellan.

The reality, however, is far more complex — and beautiful — than many realize. From flora to fauna, rocky mountain ecosystems have evolved with fires, which play a crucial role in protecting the biodiversity of the natural landscape.

"It's a renewal process that will enhance biodiversity and the different functions of these ecosystems over time — not just before and after," McLellan explains.

Visitors will see the uplifting sights of new growth very quickly — and stunningly. Fireweed brightening your day and your trails this season is just the beginning.

You may also find unexpectedly epic mountain views with less forest canopy on the trails, as well as an abundance of woodpeckers.

"The mountains are so beautiful," says McLellan. "Some of the trails in the valley bottom are often forested, if people go on those trails now they'll have a better view of the mountain scenery."

Since the regeneration timeline is long, it allows different species to benefit from fires decades after they've burned.

It's a renewal process that will enhance biodiversity and the different functions of these ecosystems over time – not just before and after

Take grizzly bears, for example, who spend their days fattening up for winter dining on plants like buffalo berries and huckleberries. Those species flourish after fires immediately at lower elevations, and 50 years from now, species at higher elevations will continue to benefit.

Whitebark pine, an at-risk tree species that grizzlies also love to snack on, will get a leg up on regeneration thanks to the newly open areas and help propagating from Clark's nutcracker, a plucky type of jaybird.

It's an ongoing, exciting and visually stunning process that will continue for years to come. ***Thank you for being here to experience it with us!***

- Travel through burn areas quickly
- Avoid remote areas if fire danger is high

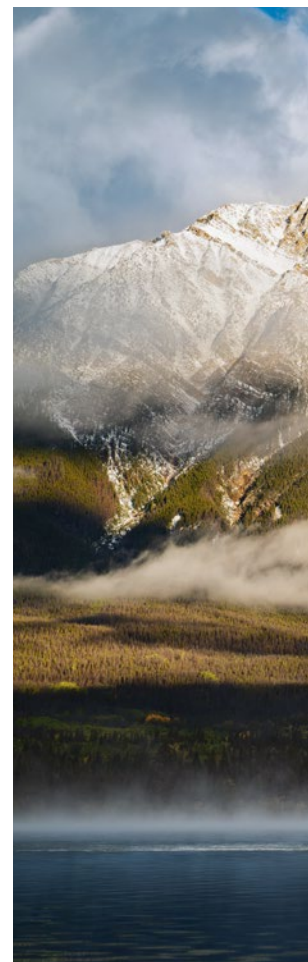
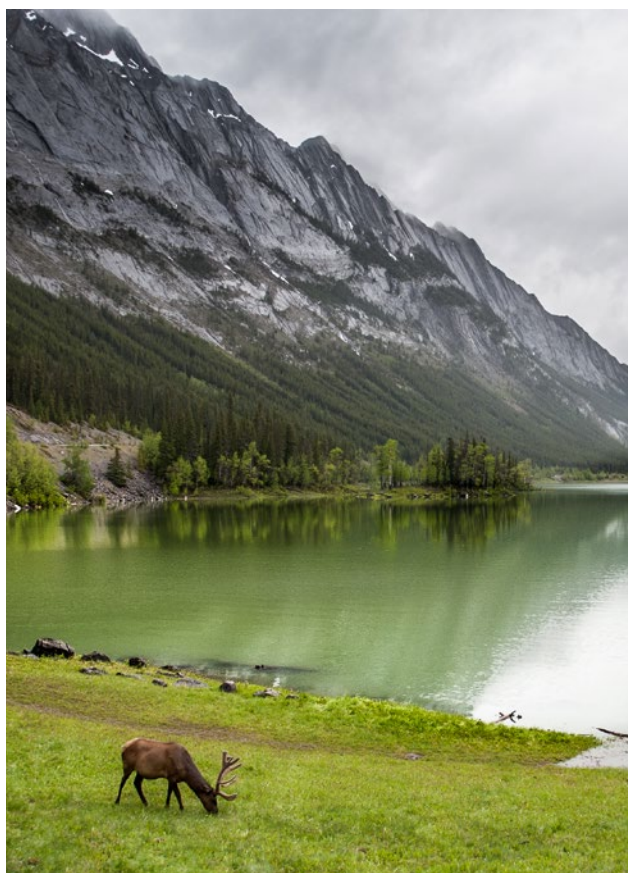

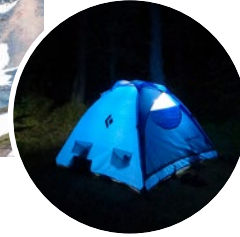

Whether you'd like to stroll an interpretive loop near town with the family or hike for days in rugged terrain, we have the perfect trail (and guide) for you. Exploring with one of Jasper's passionate local experts can help ensure the experience is fun, safe, and entertaining.

Go further into the wilderness with this company. Starry Mountain Adventures focus on longer and more remote backcountry trails, including the rugged North and South Boundary Trails as well as the Great Divide Trail to help people tackle hikes that they may not have otherwise been able to do. New backpackers might prefer the Fiddle River trip, which still offers that remote serenity. Walk away having seen beautiful and historic areas that few other park visitors get to witness, and newfound confidence in your own backcountry abilities. Lead guide, Ben Nearingburg, is an expert hiker and Jasper local who literally wrote the book on peak bagging in the Rockies and has many stories to tell.

See the sights with one of their ever-popular wildlife hiking tours in the spring and fall or challenge yourself with multi-day backpacking trips. Private sightseeing tours are also available. In the winter, explore a frozen canyon on a guided icewalk, go on a snowshoe adventure or venture further with a guided backcountry ski tour (all required gear is available to rent). Environmental stewardship is a core tenet of their business, with leave-no-trace ethics and team participation in annual clean-up efforts along the highway and trails. Dog lovers will fall in love with the owner's impressively trained Suka, who joins some of the (approved) trips too.

BIKING

Experience Jasper as most locals do: on two wheels! Avoid traffic and full parking lots and BYOB (bring your own bike) or rent one locally. Convenient and family-friendly trails connect Whistlers campground to downtown in about 15 minutes. Pack a lunch, some bear spray, and use pedal power to score a win-win for both your health and the well-being of the park.

ROCKABOO MOUNTAIN ADVENTURES

Channel your inner Spiderman and get to know the rock that makes up the Rocky Mountains. Even complete beginners can learn the ropes (literally) and scale limestone slabs on one of Rockaboo Mountain Adventures' four-hour, twice-daily trips (though basic fitness is recommended). A short, 5-10 minute hike leads to the main climbing site, which overlooks the stunning Athabasca River.

Rockaboo's other popular summer adventure is the Tread Lightly Glacier Hike. This sustainability-focused tour of the Athabasca Glacier gets you intimately acquainted with the prehistoric, ever-changing ice sheets — depending on conditions, you might even venture into an ice cave. Offered from June 1 to September 30.

OTHER SUMMER ADVENTURES

Venture beyond the usual with activities that blend adrenaline, beauty, and character.



JASPER RIDING STABLES

Saddle up and follow in the hoofprints of past explorers with gentle and well-trained western mountain horses. From first time rider to horse whisperer, all experience levels will enjoy this scenic foray into nature. Tour options range from family-friendly half-hour jaunts through aspen forest to one and two-hour rides around Pyramid Bench and Cottonwood Slough, passing sweeping ridges that overlook the Athabasca River Valley and surrounding mountains. Staff pick from more than 50 well-cared-for horses to match guests to the steed that will suit them best based on ability and profile, ensuring you return home with a darn good yarn. This activity is suited for kids aged six and older. In the winter, snuggle under a blanket for a magical, bell-laden sleigh ride along Pyramid Lake (only offered on select days, weather permitting).

EMBARK OUTPOST + PROVISIONS

Adventure essentials and specialty coffee await on the lower floor of Fairmont Jasper Park Lodge. This is where both overnight guests and day visitors can book canoes, stand-up paddleboards and other watercraft to use on Lac Beauvert (or in the winter: skates, cross-country skis and snowshoes). The helpful and knowledgeable Adventure Concierge can match you with the right gear and share tips and maps on where to go. You can also rent other trail kits like a hiking backpack, sunscreen, bear spray, first aid kit, bug spray, and hiking poles. WHITewater RAFTING

With so many rivers in the national park, whitewater rafting has become one of Jasper's most popular summer activities. Widen your perspective on Class II and Class III rapids with guides who can provide all the gear you need including wetsuits, life jackets, and more. These tours are generally available from early May to late September.



ROCKY MOUNTAIN RIVER GUIDES

Water has been a powerful force of change within the national park and when shooting the Sunwapta River's Class 3 rapids, it's easy to see why. Rocky Mountain River Guides offers a thrilling adventure for adrenaline seekers and water lovers who prefer to peep incredible scenery through the spray of fast, fun waves. The Sunwapta's Indigenous name roughly translates to turbulent waters — and the trip ends with a glacial faceful of water from a wave called the Whopper! For a more moderate adrenaline rush, there are also two slightly milder tours down the Athabasca River, which are great options for participants younger than 12 years old. New this year: Say yes somewhere unforgettable. For those ready to embark on the adventure of a lifetime, Rocky Mountain River Guides is partnering with Sonderlust to offer Adventure Elopement packages. Shutter bugs can take advantage of the new Paddle and Pics on-river photography experience in partnership with Jasper Photo Tours. No previous experience is necessary for any of the tours, so everyone can release their inner river rat!

The Athabasca, Sunwapta, and Fraser Rivers each have different intensities, from Class 2 rapids (great for families and apprehensive first-timers) to Class 3+ (perfect for stoked, fit beginners and adrenaline seekers). The Athabasca Falls Canyon Run splashes through some fun, gentler Class 2+ rapids before floating into the scenic Athabasca Valley. The Sunwapta River Trip is Class 3, with a steep gradient and many rapids that are most intense mid-June to late July. You can also travel a bit further afield to reach the mighty Fraser River (trust us, the drive is worth it). Count on getting wet in this river's turbulent Class 3+ rapids. Includes a short portage and the chance to spot seasonal spawning salmon. Or, get even closer to the action with their new inflatable whitewater kayak tours. These easy-handling, sit-on-top kayaks are known for their buoyancy and stability, meaning even thrill-seeking first timers can feel the rush of paddling themselves through some Class 2 fun.

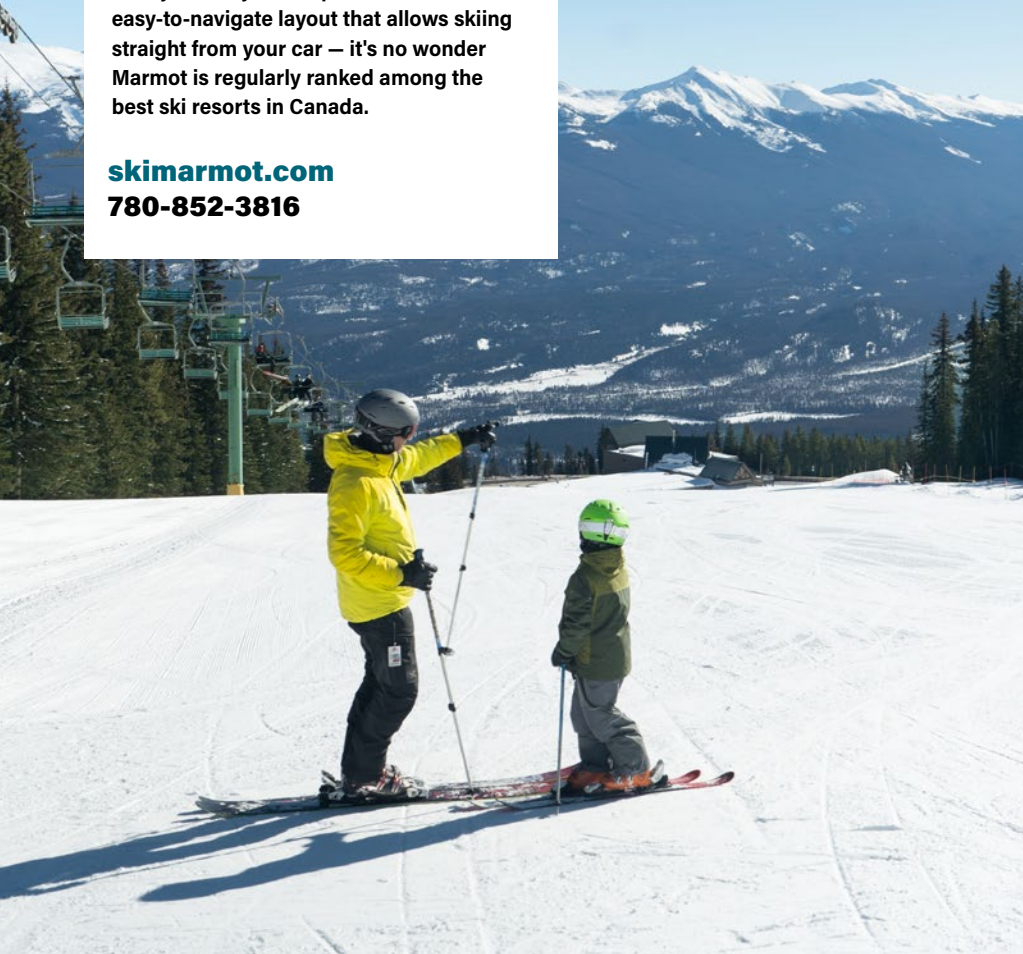

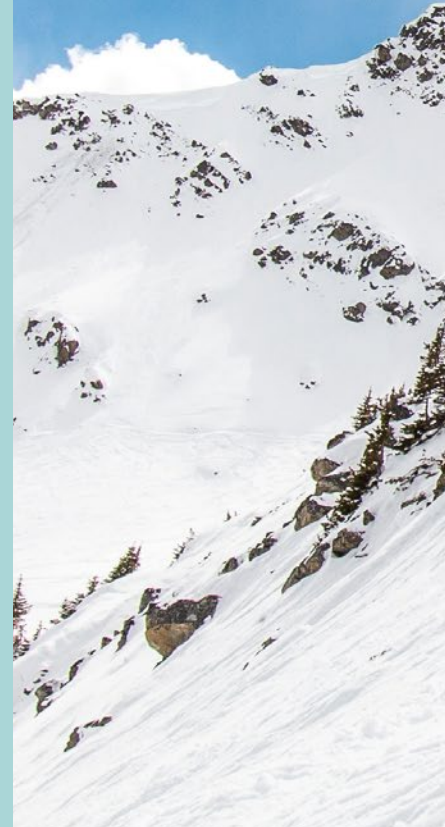

SKATING

Not including the Jasper Arena (303 Bonhomme St.), there are two main places to skate in Jasper National Park. Pyramid Lake has a rink with stunning views of Pyramid Mountain. Rent skates (or other winter sports gear) and grab dinner at [Aalto](#) inside the nearby [Pyramid Lake Lodge \(p.55\)](#). The groomed ice at Mildred Lake is on the grounds of [Fairmont Jasper Park Lodge \(p.54\)](#); go to [Embark Outpost + Provisions](#) on the main lodge's lower level for rentals, including helmets, hockey sticks, and pucks if you fancy a game of shinny.

ICE WALKS

Don't miss one of winter's most otherworldly activities that also happens to be unique to Jasper. Strap on anti-slip crampons and walk into the hidden depths of a frozen canyon that few people know about, much less get to see. Make your way through Pleckaitis Canyon and discover towering walls, narrow chutes, and an unmatched solitude that makes the place feel all your own. Navigate waterfalls of ice and winding hallways of rock with one of two local guiding companies providing this limited time offer. The 3-hour [SunDog Tour Co. \(p.28\)](#) experience can be packaged with other sightseeing tours for a discounted price. [Jasper Hikes and Tours \(p.17\)](#) leads small groups and offers hot apple cider on tour. Icewalks are usually available from mid-December to late March, depending on the weather. Appropriate for ages six and older.

Note: Maligne Canyon was significantly affected by the 2024 wildfire and is currently closed to ALL activity, including ice walks, ice climbing, and hiking.





ICE CLIMBING

Discover why people travel from across the world to experience ice climbing in the Canadian Rockies. **Rockaboo Mountain Adventures'** exhilarating and surprisingly beginner-friendly Ice Climbing Experience— if you can climb a ladder, you can climb a frozen waterfall — invites you to experience the landscape. The six-hour adventure takes guests to a frozen waterfall in the park (which one depends on the day's conditions and group ability). Short on time? Their new in-town climbing wall means you don't have to go far to get your fix. The unique, multi-disciplinary structure is made with specialized irrigation to create multiple winter climbing options in the heart of town. Some routes mimic natural ice walls, some are tailored for for dry-tooling, and others are climbable with just gloves!

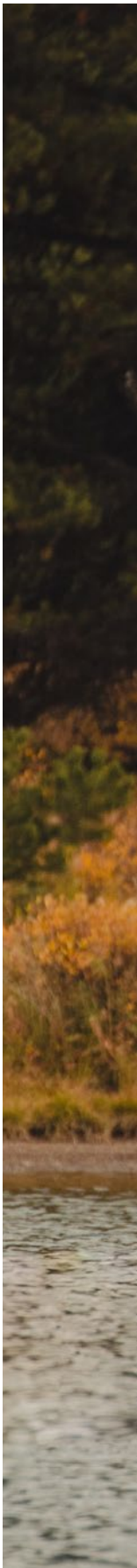


JASPER RAFT TOURS

Bring the whole family on this gentle, scenic and fun float tour down the Athabasca River. The specially designed seven-metre-long orange rafts provide stability and comfort while the entertaining and experienced guides do all the rowing while pointing out wildlife along the way. Everyone from ages 3 to 99 can hop aboard this accommodating tour that spends 60 to 75 minutes on the water (exact duration depends on water level; total tour lasts 2 to 2.5 hours) and travels a leisurely stretch of the river that's mostly calm but does feature a few small rapids. Tours run rain or shine through the spring, summer and fall. Includes transportation from town.

Help keep wildlife wild:

1. Never feed or bait animals.
2. Always keep your distance (Pro tip: use telephoto lens for high-quality pictures).
3. Stay in your vehicle if watching from the road.

GUIDED TOURS

While there's always the possibility of seeing animals on your own, a professional wildlife-watching tour will take guests to lesser-known areas of the park and can increase your chances of seeing one of Jasper's furriest residents while keeping you safe — though sightings can't be guaranteed. These are wild animals and are not confined by fences, after all. The knowledgeable guides also give a more well-rounded understanding of the local fauna, and letting someone else do the driving means you can keep your eyes on the sights and off the road. Some of the best times to see wildlife are spring (when furry babies abound) and fall (when the elk rut makes males more active — and dangerous).

Jasper companies with wildlife-focused experiences:

SunDog Tour Co.'s (p.28) year-round wildlife tours include guided transportation on mini-coach buses with oversized sightseeing windows — some even slide open, enabling unobstructed photography. Guests can also touch genuine horns and furs from local specimens.

Maligne Adventure's (p.28) highly rated wildlife tours are offered after sunrise or before sunset from May 2 to October 4. Complimentary pick-up is available from select accommodations.

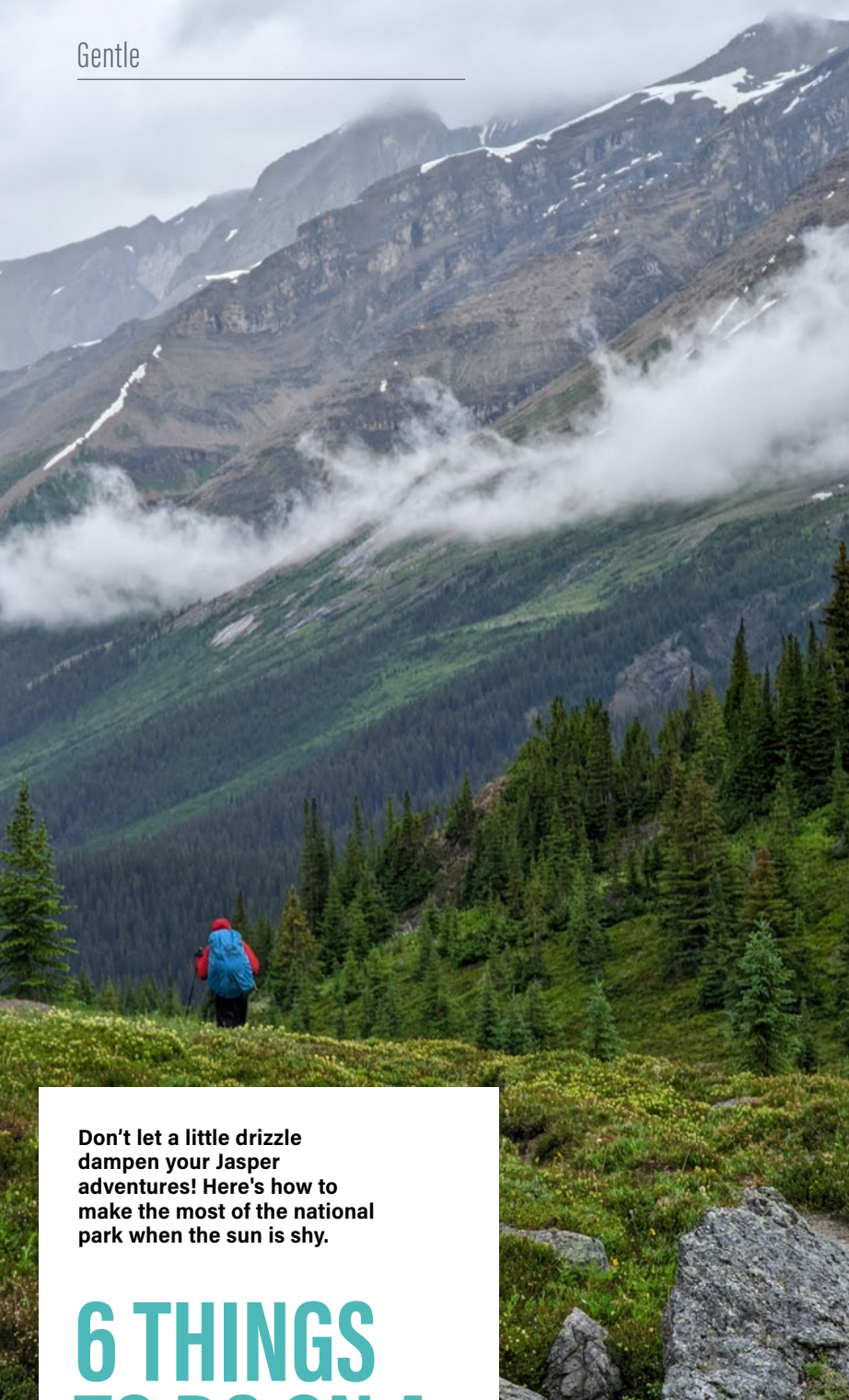

3. SHOPPING

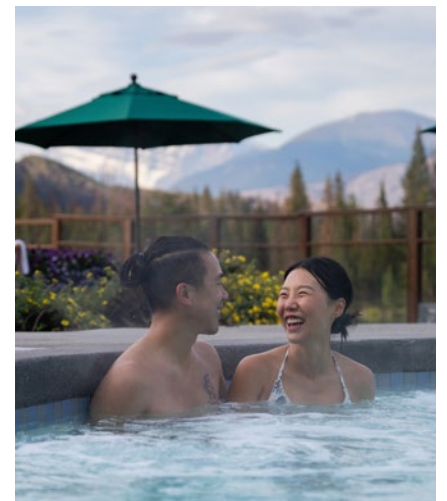

and early tourism in the National Park. The museum is also home to a large wildlife collection — from moose to beaver, caribou to grizzly bear — these critters on display throughout the museum will impress visitors of all ages. as many areas of the national park don't have cell service.

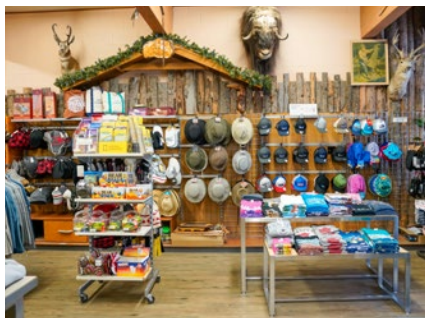
• **When hitting the trails, always carry a can of bear spray,** and know how to use it.

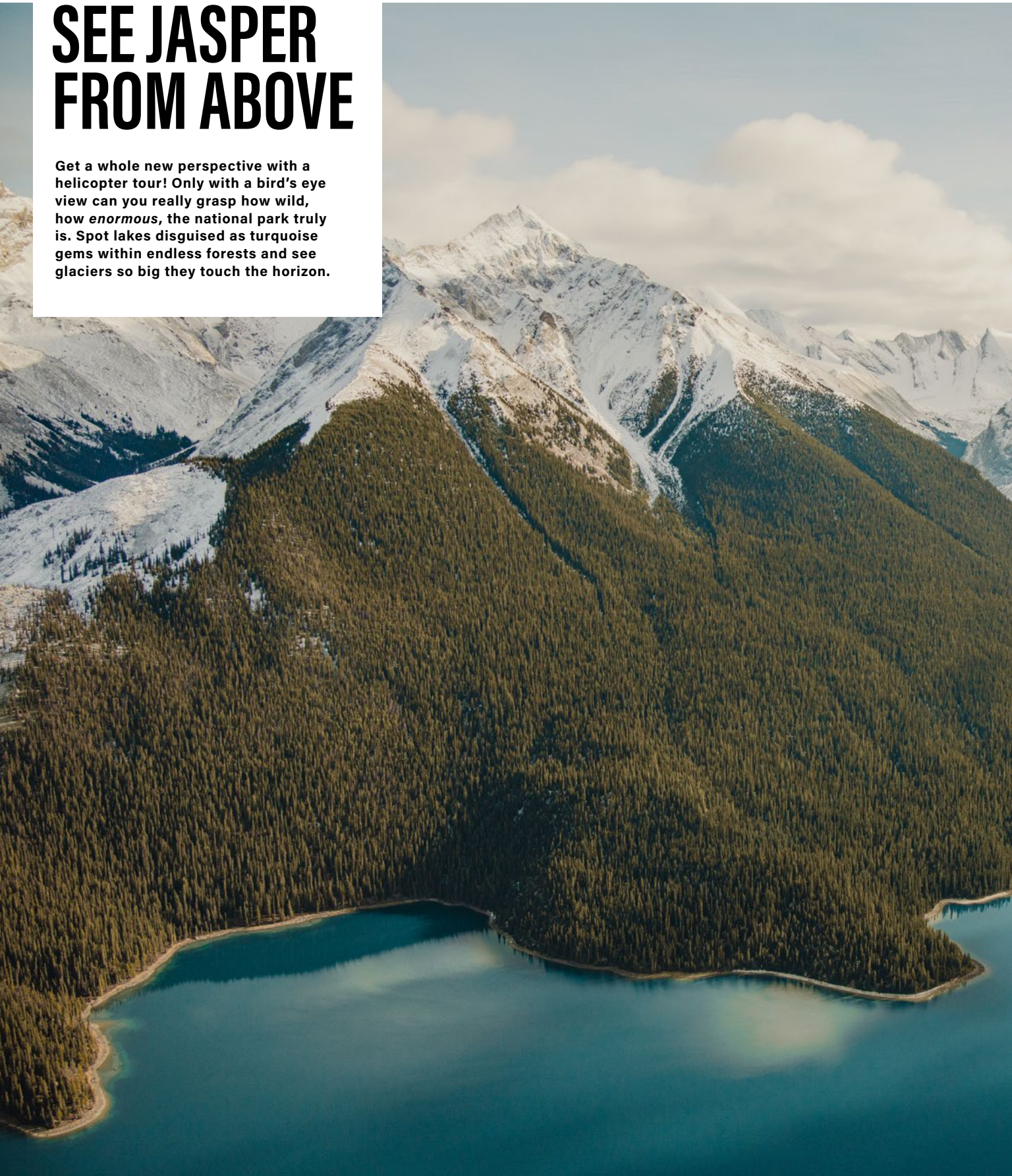

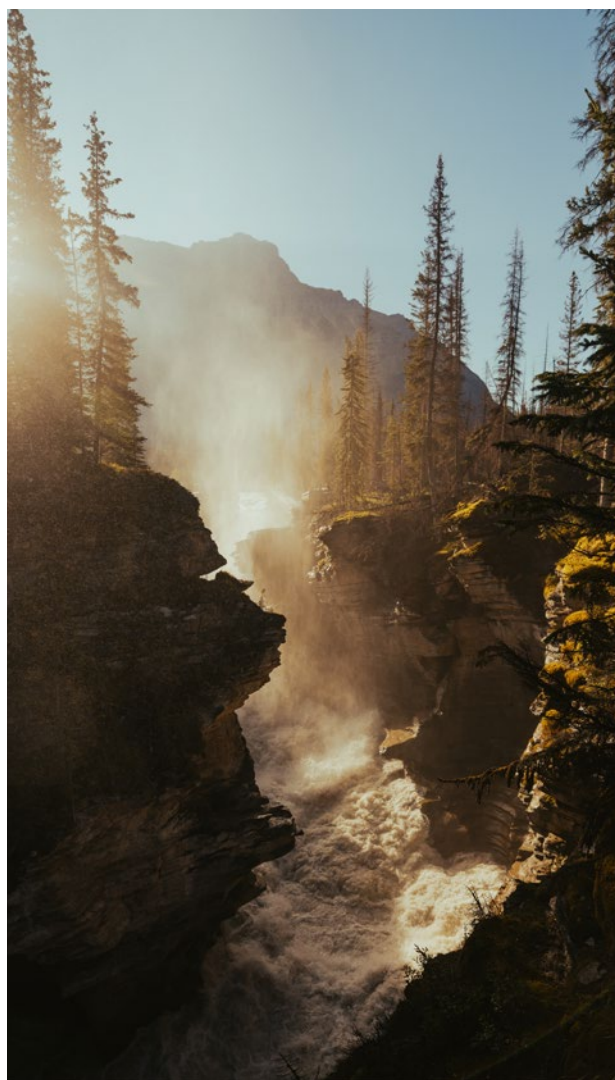
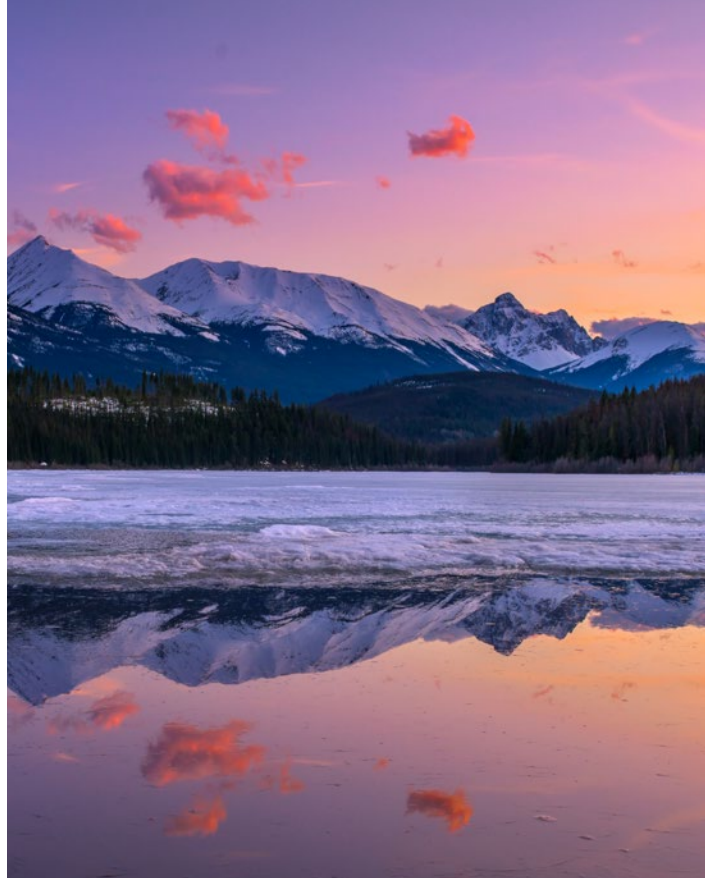

5 THINGS TO DO AT THE JASPER SKYTRAM

The Jasper SkyTram makes it easy to quickly gain a 360-degree view of the national park — but there's so much more to do at the top of Whistlers Mountain than simply stand in awe. Bonus: many Jasper activities and tours can be combined with a SkyTram flight into a package deal!

1. LEARN

During the seven-minute flight, your guide points out areas of interest. Once you reach the top at 2,263 metres high, it's time to explore the barrier-free boardwalk at the upper station.

2. HIKE

From the summit terminal, a 1.4-kilometre alpine trail leads up the mountain. Weather that high is always unpredictable, so bring layers and stay on the path.

3. SNOWSHOE

Since the alpine snowpack melts slower than in the valleys, spring visitors can explore using snowshoes rented from the summit terminal retail store.

4. STARGAZE

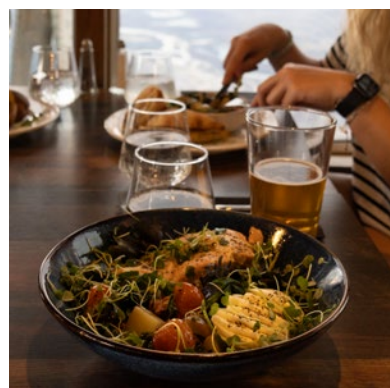
On select days in the fall, Star Sessions include after-dark flights, dinner at the Summit restaurant and telescope viewing with astronomy experts.

5. SPOT WILDLIFE

The mountain was named for the hoary marmot's whistling alert call. Watch for these furry critters and other wildlife that live in the alpine environment.

WARRIOR WOMEN

Hear the Indigenous stories of this land, feel the heartbeat of the drum and have an intimate and candid conversation with a local Indigenous Knowledge Keeper.

The Fireside Chat offered by Warrior Women is a truly unique and personal experience which includes musical performances and Cree legends from singer and drummer Matricia Bauer, whose traditional name of Isko-achitaw wacyi / Δ^oδ Δ^oΓC Δ^oΓ+ translates to "she who moves mountains."

Other experiences include the Miskan Trap Line Experience*. This hands-on tour teaches hide tanning, fur management, antlers and skull identification (2-3 hours). The new Indigenous Art Tour (1.5 hours) guides you to the Indigenous art around town.

Or join the Wapakwanis Plant Walk, Make and Talk to see the local landscape through an Indigenous lens, learn the medicinal and traditional significance of local flora, and make a product to take home. Meanwhile, tea enthusiasts should check out Tawaw Nihty. This time-honoured ritual includes a healing cup of tea made with Indigenous herbology. 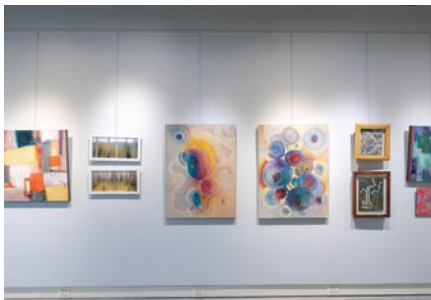


JASPER ART GALLERY

Seeing Jasper has been described as walking through a painting — which might explain why so many gifted artists have found inspiration here. Discover the wealth of local creativity at the Jasper Art Gallery. Located within the Jasper Library and Cultural Centre, the Gallery is run by the Jasper Artists Guild, a grassroots organization that promotes visual fine arts within the region.

Discover vibrant art events all year round, from multimedia community showcases to seasonal exhibits from guild members. In addition to the excellent original landscape and abstract art it exhibits (pro tip: these pieces make for truly unique souvenirs and bring mountain charm to any home's décor) the gallery also has prints, cards and a small selection of crafts for sale. Even for casual admirers, the gallery is worth a visit. Natural light bathes the modern space, and the colourful art shines amid stone and wood architectural features. From oils to watercolour to wood carvings to stained glass, the varied mediums reflect the ever-changing beauty that waits just outside.

Since its launch in 2022, the annual UpLift! Jasper Mural Festival has invited professional artists from across Canada and the world to create vibrant public art pieces, turning the town into open-air gallery. 5 VISITOR EXPERIENCE CENTRE ▶

Get in-person guidance, helpful resources and personal recommendations at this fun new venue next to the Old Fire Hall. More info on [p.7](#).

6 OLD FIRE HALL

Built in the Rustic Style favoured by national parks in the 20s and 30s with a steeply gabled roof and a corner tower, this prominent landmark is recognized for its historical and architectural value.

7 COMMEMORATION PARK

See the Jim Vena Stage at CN place, where all the best outdoor concerts and events are held.

8 TRAIN STATION

When it was built in 1925, this station was one of the largest and finest in the country, with large cobblestone chimneys and exposed rafter ends. It is a big part of the town's origin story.

Jasper is best explored on foot, with most of the town's commercial activity located along Connaught Drive and Patricia Street. Park your vehicle in one of the multiple lots on the periphery of the downtown core. Municipal transportation buses are also available. In winter, catch the ski shuttle up to Marmot Basin from multiple hotels, or ride the Pony Express to dinner for a unique experience.

AROUND JASPER

1 JASPER MUNICIPAL LIBRARY

With books aplenty and local art shows, this bright and clean space is a quiet haven.

2 SHOPPING

Find the perfect locally designed souvenir or pick up mountain-ready adventure gear at one of Jasper's unique shops. See [p.34](#) for more information on local retail.

3 JASPER INDIGENOUS EXHIBIT

Located on the lawn of the Information Centre, the exhibit creates a space for Indigenous partners to communicate their connection to the land and recognize the history of displacement.

4 CENTENNIAL PARK

Built to celebrate Canada's hundredth anniversary, Jasper's major park has a playground, three ball diamonds, a soccer/rugby pitch, public washrooms, and picnic area.

JASPER'S DARK SKY PRESERVE

Welcome to a place where nighttime darkness is protected. Here, artificial lighting and light pollution are minimized, allowing far-off celestial bodies to be more visible in the sky. Jasper National Park is the world's second-largest Dark Sky Preserve and is the largest accessible Dark Sky Preserve — meaning there's a town within its borders. Each October, stargazers and science enthusiasts descend for the Jasper Dark Sky Festival. (p.13), but there are ways to experience the magic all year round.



JASPER PLANETARIUM

Pack a galaxy's worth of perspectives into a single evening with this fascinating and interactive year-round experience. In the Jasper Planetarium's 44-seat domed theatre, a live guide will tour you through many of Jasper's best stargazing spots, getting panoramic views of the aurora borealis, stories and explanations behind Indigenous constellations, and local tips for astro-exploration. Get hands-on experience with specialized items from their collection, such as a piece of real meteorite! Package the Planetarium Experience with the Telescope Experience and see the stars through the largest telescope in the Rockies. Cloudy skies? See pre-recorded events through the video telescope (or opt for their two-year raincheck policy). Fun and family-friendly, these tours are great options for kids whose bedtimes fall before the sun does.

JASPER STAR TRAILS

Go off the beaten path and into distant galaxies with passionate local astronomy guide Joel Cooper. His two-hour outdoor tour uses laser-pointers and both optical and digital telescopes to help you go deeper into all things space. Operating beside the gorgeous Lake Annette, bring your blankets, chairs, cameras, snacks and a curious mind ready to find constellations. The telescopes work well even in 60% cloud cover but if the sky is completely overcast then the tour leans more into the educational side of things: the origin and life cycle of stars (see past images captured by their telescopes) and the technology involved in astronomy, recent discoveries and the future space race. During summer's long days try solargazing! Using specialized equipment, examine the sun and learn how it affects aurora borealis.

DOG PARK

Jasper's only fully fenced off-leash dog park is located at the intersection of Sleepy Hollow Rd. and Hazel Ave.

JASPER SKYTRAM

Dogs are allowed in the tram cars that soar to the summit of Whistlers Mountain in seven minutes (p.40).

JASPER RAFT TOURS

Strap on a canine-approved life jacket with dog-friendly trips lasting between 1.5 and 2.5 hours. (p.29)

CANOEING OR SUPING

Rent a watercraft at **Fairmont Jasper Park Lodge** (p.54) and glide peacefully across Lac Beauvert.

HIKING

If booking with **Jasper Hikes & Tours** (p.17), ask in advance whether dogs are allowed on your chosen tour. When hiking on your own, note that some trails don't allow dogs (even leashed) due to endangered caribou habitat so be sure to check ahead of time.

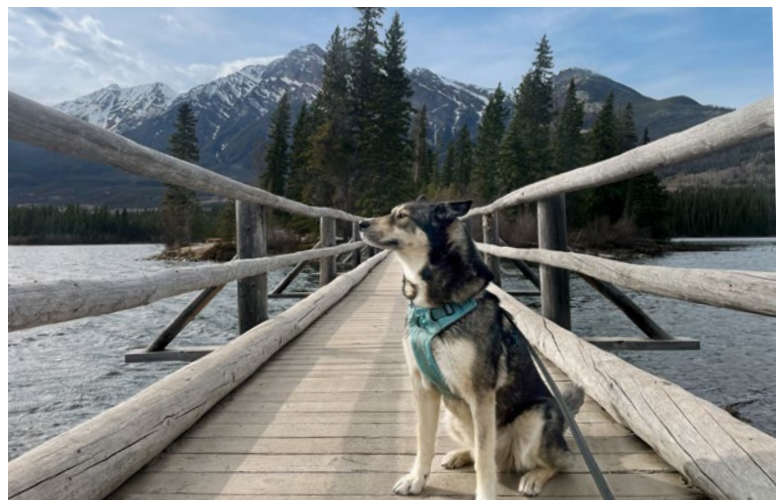

Parks Canada regulations state that all domestic animals must be always kept on a leash or in suitable confinement for both their safety and that of the wildlife. Pets must not be left unattended at campsites or in vehicles. Never allow your pet to chase any wild animal in the park and always clean up after them.

DO

Want to do a non-dog-friendly activity like skiing, horseback riding, or backcountry camping? Check out Doggy Day Care at the Jasper Pet Outpost for day or overnight options. While you're there, show 'em who's a good boy with a wide range of treats and toys. Jasperpetoutpost.ca



CAMPING

Welcome to Jasper's five thousand star hotel. Car campers, bike trippers, backcountry hikers and RV'ers can all experience the thrill of sleeping so close to nature.

The campgrounds in Jasper are managed by Parks Canada and offer convenient services, including firewood and bear-proof food lockers. Among the largest (and closest to the townsite) is Whistlers Campground, which is freshly renovated to include a new registration centre, improved sites, modernized underground services (including water, sewer and electrical systems) and new washroom and shower facilities. It's the largest single-entry campground in North America.

Meanwhile, multi-day hikers (and canoers) can book one of Jasper's many rugged backcountry campgrounds, which have basic infrastructure like tent pads, picnic tables, tent pads and pit toilets and bear lockers or cables.

Note: Demand for sites is high from June through September, with July and August at the peak. To avoid disappointment, Parks Canada recommends reserving a spot before arriving in the park.

Like many disappearing worlds, the **ATHABASCA GLACIER** is as fascinating as it is fragile. Located in the southern end of Jasper National Park (and seen here from Wilcox Pass), the famous landmark is one of six principal toes of the Columbia Icefield. At 300 square kilometres, this icefield is a prehistoric remnant of the continent-spanning sheets of ice that once carved Jasper into its current shape, and today feeds water to all three of Canada's oceans.
