This is an exclusive journey with Jasper-Hinton Air and Lauren Moberly, a Rocky Mountain Cree woman and a member of the Aseniwuche Winewak Nation of Canada. The tour begins with a scenic helicopter tour, Lauren's ancestral tales, tracing her family's path from 1909, a view of her historic homestead from an aerial perspective, and traditional bannock snacks. Tour options: 1 or 2-hour flight, total duration approx. 4 hrs. Max 5 passengers, combined weight limit 500lbs. Available year-round.

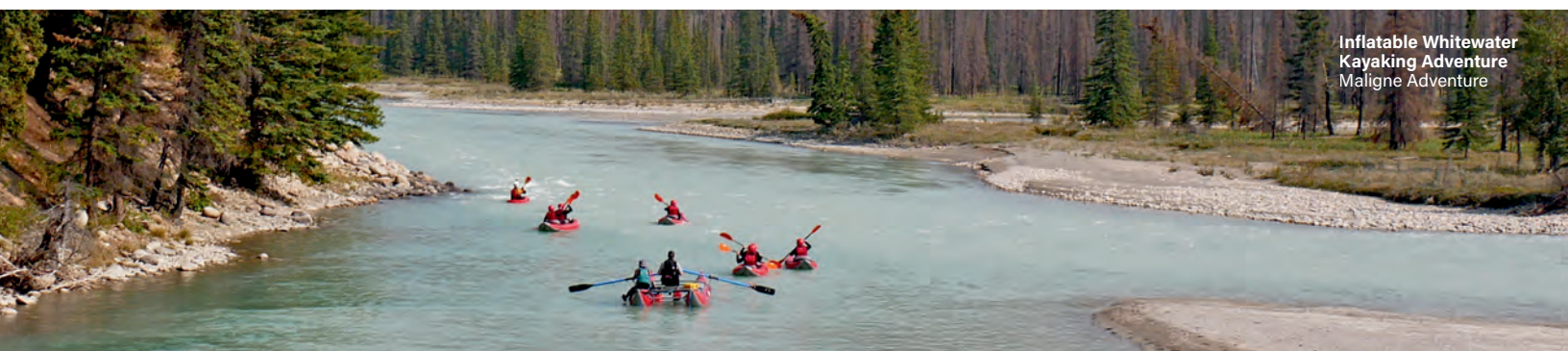

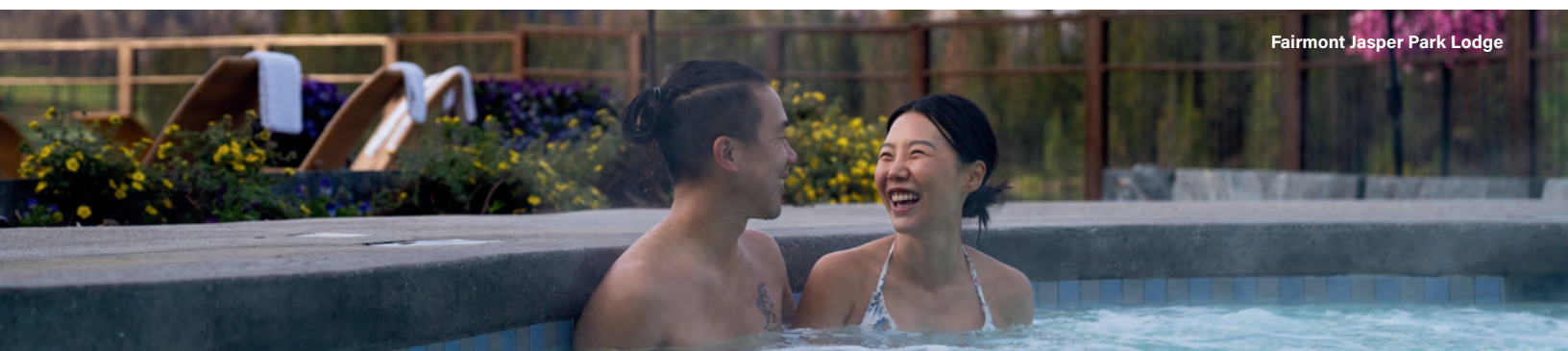

Jasper is open and welcoming visitors. While recovery from the 2024 wildfire continues and some areas remain inaccessible, this is a unique time to experience the park's natural renewal firsthand — witnessing how landscapes regenerate, ecosystems recover, and responsible travel supports the future of Jasper National Park.

Trails, Roads, and Day Use Areas

Popular areas including Whistlers Mountain, Lac Beauvert, Lake Annette, Lake Edith, and the Fifth Bridge to Sixth Bridge trail reopened in summer 2025. Most of Jasper National Park is now accessible, with recovery work continuing in select areas.



Open Summer 2026

Valley of the Five Lakes trail, plus Wabasso Lake and Curator trails, with upgrades to improve trail surfaces, signage, and visitor comfort.

Remaining Closed

Cavell Road, and Maligne Canyon, as Parks Canada continues assessments and rehabilitation work before safe reopening.



Campgrounds

Parks Canada has cleared hazard trees, restored utilities, and rebuilt infrastructure to support camping and the local tourism economy.

In 2025, about 75% of frontcountry campsites and all backcountry campsites reopened. These will return for the 2026 season, with added capacity through overflow camping and extended dates if needed.

Closed for 2026:

Wabasso Campground, Whirlpool Group Campground, Marmot Meadows Group Campground, and part of Wapiti Campground while rebuild planning continues.



Aquatic Invasive Species measures are in place

Many front-country lakes remain open for water recreation. [Visitors are encouraged to follow Clean, Drain, Dry protocols](#) and consider local gear rentals for paddling experiences.

Large-scale glacier photography exploring environmental change along the Icefields Parkway. Open daily from May 14; admission included with Parks Canada pass.

- Bring your own bike: cycle the extensive connector trail network or use Jasper Transit



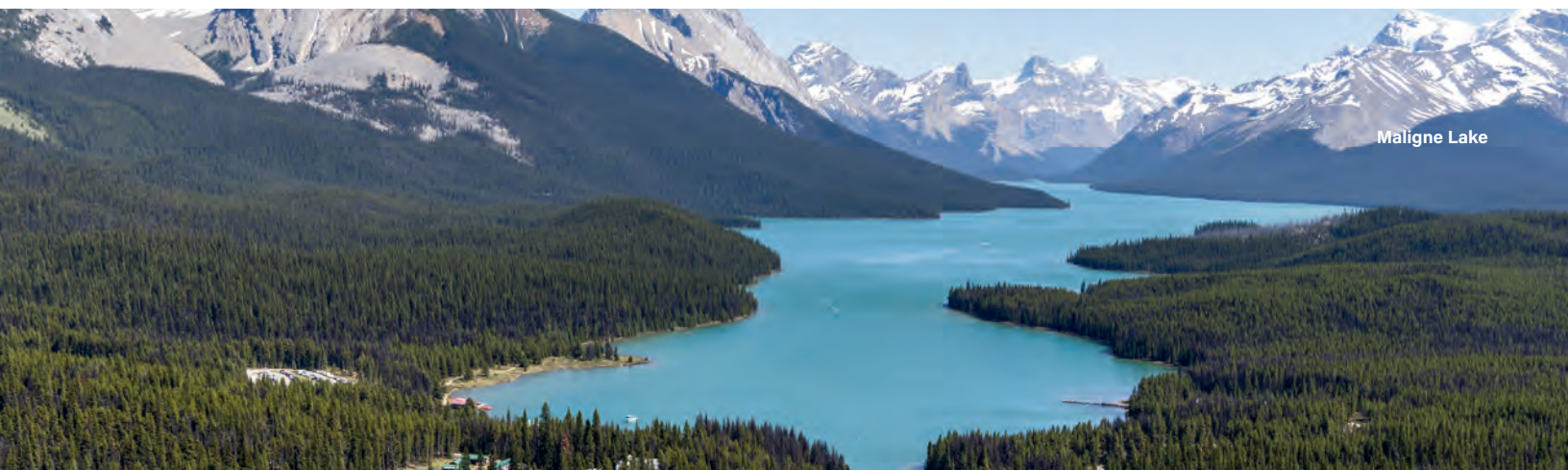

Public Transit

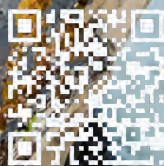
Jasper offers year-round public transit with seasonal routes. Fares start at \$3 per ride or \$8.50 daily, with monthly and multi-use passes available. A Jasper–Hinton transit connection is also available for \$15. [View routes and schedules online.](#)

Paid Parking

Paid parking is in effect annually from May 1–October 31. The 2026 rate is \$7/hour or \$28/day in parking lots. [Payment is available by QR code, payment kiosk, or the HotSpot app.](#)
