Although the Icefields Parkway can technically be driven in three hours, it is easy and recommended to spend a whole day exploring this stunning area. Bookend the journey at the locally owned and operated Mount Robson Inn (and its sister hotel the Mountaineer Lodge in Lake Louise). The beds are divine, the breakfast room has mountain views and an excellent menu, and the staff is super friendly. Don't feel like driving yourself? Book a spot on SunDog Transportation and Tours' daily connector shuttles to and from Jasper, with service to Edmonton, Edson, Hinton, Calgary, Banff and Lake Louise.

Equipped with wi-fi, comfortable seats, bathrooms and large windows perfect for sightseeing, these shuttles are also a great option for travellers who'd prefer to focus on the scenery instead of the road. All guests can bring one carry on, one suitcase and one personal item (additional and oversized luggage is allowed for a fee).

Walk-up passengers are welcome, but subject to seat availability; pre-booking is highly recommended. Please arrive

at pick-up location 15 minutes prior to departure time. In Jasper, pickups can be arranged at all hotels/ accommodations. Edmonton pickups are at the West Edmonton Mall, downtown locations (including some hotels) and the Edmonton International Airport (EIA).

Private transportation in safe, reliable luxury vehicles can also be arranged (both to get here, and to explore around the national park) to make the most of every minute of your Jasper itinerary.

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

If national parks had resumes, Jasper's would be impressive. After all, there's plenty of facts that make us look good on paper. Jasper is the largest national park in the Canadian Rockies. We have the second largest dark sky preserve in the world. The Columbia Icefield, which marks the country's hydrological apex and feeds water into all three of Canada's oceans, is located within our borders.

But Jasper's greatness extends beyond the waterfalls, glaciers, wildlife, lakes, canyons, forests and of course the mountains that helped establish this region as a UNESCO World Heritage Site. The real heart of Jasper, the reason why so many people travel to reach our pocket of beauty (and why quite a few decide to never leave), is the community culture that binds us.

There's a peacefulness here. Except of course when we rally together to celebrate everything that makes us special, through events like the Jasper Pride Festival, Jasper in January, and the Jasper Dark Sky Festival. So walk the trails, picnic amongst the peaks, respect the wildlife, and venture beyond your ordinary.







Between the families who've lived here for multiple generations and the mountain lovers who chose this as their home, you'll never have to work hard to find a hiking buddy or a potluck invite. This is a place where small businesses support the community and the community supports them right back.

Our town may be small, but as many have learned over the past century, the longer you stay the more vou discover.

wbat to pack

Mountain exploration requires proper preparation. Stay comfortable and safe with these sample packing essentials. Remember: each trip is different, so make a list tailored to your own adventure!





GEAR TIPS

Weather can change quickly in the mountains. Bring multiple layers (e.g.: base, mid, top/shell layer) to wear in case of fluctuating temperatures.

Higher elevation often means colder temperature. Places like the Columbia lcefield and Maligne Lake are usually a few degrees chillier than the town. Before heading out on the trails, ensure you've already broken in new boots to help reduce the chance of blisters.

Bring physical maps or have maps predownloaded on your device in preparation for the areas of the national park that don't have cellphone service.

Where to see wildlife The best places to see wildlife are where there's not a let of nearly lit

where there's not a lot of people. It also depends on the time of year; for example in spring the Icefields Parkway is good for spotting bears. We want people to have wildlife viewing opportunities but when they watch for a long time that's when we get traffic jams. Take a few photos from your vehicle then move on. As a wildlife lover I want the animals to have a long life in the park; by not feeding them and respecting their space we help make that happen.

Biggest misconception

A lot of people think and act like the animals are tame and that it's okay to approach them. But just because an animal tolerates our presence doesn't mean they're not wild. We have signs everywhere about calving and rutting season (when many animals are more aggressive) but people still often put themselves in danger.



Top wildlife tip

The main messages are: 1) do not feed the animals and 2) give them space. It's nice to take photos but it's important to do it properly. Look around and assess the situation; if it seems chaotic then just keep driving.



JASPER RIDING STABLES

Saddle up! Before trains, planes or automobiles, people explored the mountains and vallevs of Jasper astride a trusty steed. Follow in their hoofprints with this family friendly experience, which takes riders as young as six years old on guided horseback riding tours ranging from one to three hours (note that riders younger than 18 must be accompanied by an adult). With sweeping, rugged views from the trail of the Athabasca River Valley and a decent chance of seeing wildlife, equestrians of all skill levels soon transform into cowboys. Jasper Riding Stables hand-picks their lovable horses specifically for their gentle nature.

ROCKY MOUNTAIN RIVER GUIDES

Water has been a powerful force of change within the national park, and when shooting the class 3 rapids on Sunwapta River, it's easy to see why. Rocky Mountain River Guides' Wapta Tour is a thrilling adventure for people who prefer to see incredible scenery through the spray of fast, fun waves (the Sunwapta's Indigenous name roughly translates to turbulent waters) and ends with a glacial facial from a wave called The Whopper. For a more moderate adrenaline rush, there's also two slightly milder tours down the Athabasca River, which are great options if participants are younger than 12 years old or lighter than 90 pounds. No previous experience is necessary for any of the tours, so go find your adventurous truth and release your inner river rat!

CLIMB WITH ROCKABOO MOUNTAIN ADVENTURES

If you can climb a ladder, then hard as it may be to imagine, you can climb a frozen waterfall. With good gear and guided instruction, ice climbing is surprisingly accessible and one heck of a good time. The six-hour beginner's excursion is a great way to find out why ice climbers from around the world travel to the Canadian Rockies. Visiting in summer? Don a rock climbing harness, chalk up and let Rockaboo guide you up the most perfectly scenic limestone wall overlooking the Athabasca River. No previous climbing experience necessary.



SKI MARMOT BASIN

When it's not charming people with its stunning views and uncrowded slopes, this beloved skier's heaven (known by local Jasperites as 'the hill') is winning accolades far and wide. It was recently ranked as the most affordable ski resort in North America and helped establish Jasper as the friendliest ski town on the continent.



1 HIGHEST BASE ELEVATION OF ANY MAJOR CANADIAN SKI AREA

At 1,698 metres, the ski chalet at the base of Marmot Basin offers incredible views of surrounding mountain ranges, to say nothing of the panoramic extravaganza that awaits from the upper areas.

2 EXTENDED SKI SEASON

Partly thanks to its high elevation, Marmot Basin enjoys a longer season than most ski resorts. Open from mid-November to May, the mountain averages over 450 centimetres of dry Alberta snow every year.

If you haven't Before it became a hotspot for powder hounds, the area played host to a very different demographic. In 1942 the British army used Marmot Basin for alpine training maneuvers requiring a crude trail for snowmobile and snow cat transportation of the troops.

4 SUSTAINABLE WATER SYSTEMS

Marmot Basin's water supply comes from natural, underground streams on the mountain that flow year-round. All excess water not used in the operation continues down to the Athabasca Valley and all wastewater undergoes treatment to ensure the maintained health of the watershed.

5 TEMPERATURE INVERSIONS

Usually, the higher elevation you are, the colder it is. But thanks to a fun scientific effect wherein cool air can get trapped beneath a layer of warmer air (the inversion layer) then Marmot Basin can experience temperatures that are 10-15°C warmer at mid-mountain than in the much lower town of Jasper.

6 GREAT FOR FAMILIES

Need childcare while you shred? No problem. Marmot Basin's on-mountain Little Rascals Nursery entertains tots from 19 months to 6 years old. If your rascals want to hit the slopes, programs like Marmot Mites or Tiny Tracks are great options.

7 NEW EXPERT TERRAIN

Tres Hombres is a steep, long, and wide open bowl that sits on the north face of the mountain. It only opened to the public in 2018, but its name harks back to three rebel skiers who illegally snuck into the area in the 1970s. Allegedly the run was so good, they had to ski it a second time.

EXPLORE MALIGNE VALLEY WITH PURSUIT

The deepest canyon in the Canadian Rockies. A lake that drains into underground caves. The famous Spirit Island. The Maligne Valley has no shortage of natural wonders and visitors can easily spend a full day exploring this beautiful and historic region of the national park, though six hours should be enough to cover the basics if time is tight.

From the town of Jasper (fill up your tank before heading out - there's no gas stations on the way) head down the Maligne Road to get into the valley, which is sandwiched between the beautiful Maligne and Elizabeth mountain ranges.

Along the way, take time to stop at scenic Medicine Lake, which vanishes and re-appears annually as it drains and then refills a huge underground karst system that flows into the Maligne Canyon river system. Watch for wildlife, especially if it's earlier in the morning.

Around 20 minutes later reach Maligne Lake, the second largest glacier-fed lake in the Canadian Rockies. Grab a sweet treat at the new Waffle Hut and gear up for canoeing around Home Bay or boating the 14 kilometers to iconic Spirit Island aboard Pursuit's guided, 1.5 hour Classic Cruise or 2 hour Premium Cruise.



Once your camera has had enough snow-capped peaks towering over the stunning blue-green lake, call it a day and head back to Maligne Canyon. There, follow the interpretive trail along the edge of the canyon, which gradually deepens and narrows to 50 metres deep and only a few metres wide. Most of the 4 kilometre trail can be walked in an hour, but you'll probably want to take more time.

CYCLE ALL YEAR WITH THE BENCH BIKE SHOP

Biking has been called everything from "a simple pleasure" to "the finest transport known to man" to a metaphor for life itself. At the Bench Bike Shop, this two-wheeled sport is a year-round joy and great way to see the national park. With Konabrand rentals, bike sales and repairs available for both summer cycling and winter fat biking (and everything in-between), this friendly independent nook on Patricia St. caters to all skill levels and provides knowledgeable route recommendations. Owner and mechanic whiz Randal Riddell has lived in Jasper for 18 years and worked with multi-championship-winning mountain biker Cory Wallace, but he's especially passionate about helping anyone and everyone have a good day on a bike.

Maligne Rafting Adventures rafts more rivers in Jasper than any other company. The Athabasca, Sunwapta and Fraser Rivers each have different intensities, from class 2 rapids (great for families and apprehensive first-timers) to class 3+ (perfect for fit beginners and adrenaline seekers). The Athabasca Falls Canyon Run splashes through some fun, gentler class 2+ rapids before floating into the scenic Athabasca Valley. The Sunwapta River Trip is class 3, with a steep gradient and many rapids that are most intense mid-June to late July. Or, travel a bit further afield to reach The Mighty Fraser River (trust us, the drive is worth it). Count on getting wet in this river's turbulent class 3+ rapids. Includes a short portage and the chance to spot seasonal spawning salmon.

SIGHTSEEING & WILDLIFE

Journey through the spectacular Maligne Valley in a special sightseeing vehicle on the Wildlife & Waterfalls tour. From town (complimentary hotel pick-up available) you'll first make your way toward Maligne Canyon. See cascading waterfalls during a 30-minute stop, then continue toward the extremely photogenic Medicine Lake. Wind through forest before arriving at world famous Maligne Lake. Depending which tour option you booked, embark on the Boat Tour to Spirit Island or enjoy an easy guided lakeshore walk. This tour passes through prime habitat for moose and bears (sightings are common but not guaranteed) but animal lovers should take special note of the highly-rated Wildlife Tour options, which are available in the morning and evening when fauna are most active.

JASPER RAFT TOURS

Bring the whole family on this gentle, scenic and fun tour down the Athabasca River. Jasper Raft Tours' iconic orange rafts provide stability and comfort while the funny and competent guides do all the rowing and point out wildlife along the way. With Signal and Tekarra Mountains towering on your right, Whistlers Mountain looming on the left and Pyramid Mountain eventually coming into view straight ahead, this is a delightful way to see some of the national park's most famous peaks.

Everyone from ages 2 to 102 can participate in this leisurely and accommodating tour; reviewers often mention that though the groups are often laughing, they felt perfectly safe the entire time. Jasper Raft Tours travels a stretch of river that's mostly calm but does feature a few small rapids. As such, they recommend wearing casual clothing and footwear in case a stray splash decides it wants to join the raft. Along the way, find out what makes the Athabasca a Canadian Heritage River, why the water is such a unique colour (hint: it has to do with glacial silt) and keep eyes peeled for elk, deer, moose, coyotes, eagles, ospreys, bighorn sheep and bears.

During the 60 to 90 minutes spent on water (the tour's total time is two to three hours, including transportation time from downtown Jasper) you'll learn, laugh and see the national park from a unique, perfectly scenic angle.

Tours run daily in spring and fall, and multiple times daily in summer. In case of rain, ponchos are provided.

7 THINGS TO DO AT THE JASPER SKYTRAM

The Jasper SkyTram makes it easy to gain a jawdropping bird's-eye view of Jasper National Park, but there's more to do at the top than simply stand in awe. Here's a taste of what's on offer.

LEARN

During the sevenminute flight up the mountain, your SkyTram guide explains various aspects of the tramway and the surrounding mountain ranges. Soar to an elevation of 2,263 metres, then alight and wander the interpretive boardwalk.

HIKE

From the upper station, a 1.4 kilometre hiking trail leads all the way to the summit of Whistlers Mountain. Please remember that the alpine environment and weather can be unpredictable. Always be safe, prepared, and dress appropriately.

SNOWSHOE

Since the alpine snowpack melts slower than in the valleys, spring visitors can explore the summit using one of Canada's classic winter transportation methods. Come prepared with winter gear from head to toe. Equipment rentals available at the upper station retail store.

EAT

Unwind in the Summit Restaurant, where meals and drinks are served with a side of panoramic views. During some summer months, if you reserve your SkyTram flight online in advance, you can enjoy a free breakfast or free burger at this scenic eatery.

STARGAZE

Get a little closer to the stars with the annual Star Sessions, available Fridays in September and Fridays & Saturdays in October. Join astronomy experts at the SkyTram for an exclusive dining and stargazing experience with the most powerful telescopes in the Canadian Rockies.

SPOT WILDLIFE

Whistlers Mountain was named for the hoary marmot's whistling alert call. Watch for these furry critters as well as the white-tailed ptarmigan, ground squirrels, pikas and perhaps even bighorn sheep. For brief periods in the summer, enjoy the alpine wildflowers. See wildlife rules on visitor guide pull out map.

PACKAGE DEALS

There's no shortage of activities to do in Jasper, and many can be combined into a package deal with the Jasper SkyTram.

No visit to Jasper would be complete without a stop at the Jasper Yellowhead Museum and Archives. Located a few blocks from downtown Jasper, this hidden gem tells Jasper's story in a way that's both charming and accessible.

Visitors are often impressed with the quality of the exhibits. The permanent displays have an intuitive layout, and explore the history of Indigenous and Métis people in the area, the fur trade, the railway, European exploration, the story of Mt. Alberta's first ascent by Japanese climbers and early tourism in the national park.

See the legendary silver ice axe recovered from Yuko Maki's ascent of Mt. Alberta, musket balls that probably belonged to early explorer David Thompson, and a canoe built by trailblazing outfitter Donald Nelson "Curly" Phillips.

This haven of history is more than just a museum; it brings the community together. Along with high quality exhibits, the museum hosts a variety of events such as speaker series, farmer's markets, art sales, and more. Temporary exhibits rotate through the Showcase Gallery.

The Tonquin Valley is a backcountry area famous for its magnificent views of the Rampart mountain range which looms over Amethyst Lake. Every winter between November 1 and February 15, Parks Canada closes the area to protect endangered caribou. Caribou navigate deep snow on their snowshoe-ish hooves, but hard-packed human trails allow wolves access and easy hunting in otherwise difficult terrain. Known as reindeer in other parts of the world, Canada's wildest ecosystems and survive the winters on a diet of lichen. Jasper National Park is home to four herds of southern mountain woodland caribou.

4 THINGS EVERY DOG OWNER SHOULD KNOW

DOGS MUST BE ON A LEASH Parks Canada regulations state that all domestic animals must be kept on a leash or in suitable confinement at all times. Pets are not to be left unattended on

campsites or in vehicles.

OFF-LEASH DOG PARK

Jasper's only fully fenced off-leash dog park is located on the other side of the train tracks from downtown Jasper, at the intersection of Sleepy Hollow Rd. and Hazel Ave.

SOME TRAILS DON'T ALLOW DOGS

There are some areas where dogs are not allowed at all, even on a leash. These include: Leech Lake crosscountry ski trail, Skyline Trail, Tonquin Valley, Cavell Meadows Trail, Bald Hills, and Opal Hills.

ARRANGE CARE FOR YOUR DOG

Need to find a dog-sitter while you're off rafting, skiing, horseback riding or eating at a restaurant? My Jasper Nanny (p.35) will come to your hotel or campsite to make sure your pets get the exercise they need (or if you'd prefer, you can drop your dog at the nanny's home).

JASPER'S WHITEWATER RAFTING

Become a small part of Jasper's whitewater rafting history with the oldest whitewater rafting company in Canada, Since 1971, the company known today as Jasper's Whitewater Rafting has been leading visitors down the rivers that served as regional highways before people carved actual roads through the landscape. This fun and safe experience is great for every generation; indeed, it's helped multiple generations discover the joy that comes from whitewater. 

"We all bring a different interpretation to the experience of the place," Hayashi has said. "Nothing beats being there hope that my paintings can capture a bit of the viewer's memory of a place or somehow have a positive resonance

Mountain Galleries owner (and accomplished artist and filmmaker in her own right) Wendy Wacko echoes the sentiment. Since expanding the Jasper flagship gallery to locations in Banff, Whistler and Stratford, Ont., Wacko has witnessed the power art has to ignite fond memories. It provides a unique lens for guests and visitors to remember Jasper, and is arguably the most evocative souvenir anyone can bring home.



MEMORIES OF JASPER'S DARK SKY PRESERVE

As host of the Jasper Dark Sky Festival, science journalist Niki Wilson has extensive knowledge about the protected skies above Jasper National Park. But she also grew up in Jasper. Here, she writes about what those stars mean to her. On a clear night in May 1990, I lay on my back in a clearing near the Athabasca River. Music wafted by in pieces, winding around the trees that separated me from the high school graduation party raging in the distance. It was around midnight. My best friend lay beside me, shoulder touching mine. Above us, brilliant green aurora electrified the sky—great pulses of light fading in and out like erratic, celestial heartbeats. We didn't speak. Soon we would leave each other for different cities, universities, and people we had yet to meet. The future felt enormous and alluring and daunting. But for those moments, we could just lay together as memories of the past twelve years surfaced and mingled with the charge in the air.

TIPS FOR SEEING THE AURORA BOREALIS

 Jasper's fall and winter have the longest hours of darkness. It's a myth that it must be cold and/or late at night to see the aurora borealis - they're just harder to see against a bright background.

2. Look to the northern corner of the horizon for the best chance of spotting the aurora borealis, which in Latin means morning light coming from the north.

3. Get real time updates on the likelihood of seeing northerm lights with AuroraWatch a website that monitors geomagnetic activity in the area and offers a free email alert service.

How lucky we were to grow up in a place dark enough for the night sky to reveal itself and to figure so prominently in our memories. Back then it would have been hard to imagine a world that would require dark sky preserves (like Jasper's) to see the stars. But almost 30 years later, the Earth has become a place with fewer and fewer opportunities to connect with the wonders that twinkle above. It's a loss not just to the countless species that rely on celestial cues and cycles to be well, but also to humanity. Beyond the growing evidence of impact on human health, our relationship with the universe is fostered largely by our ability to glimpse it through clear, dark skies, to tie memory to the stars.

Jasper has given me so many of those night sky memories: jumping off the dock for a moonlight swim at Lake Edith. Having a night picnic at the top of Old Fort Point and picking out constellations. Rappelling into a canyon by moonlight after making a critical error and getting myself lost on Mount Hawk. Playing night hockey on Pyramid Lake under the stars. Dancing to a fiddle player under the quarter moon at an old Parks Canada warden station on my 27th birthday.

In one of my favourites, along with two other families my husband, son and I lay sardine-style on the dock at Hidden Cove paddle camp on Maligne Lake. We are watching stars shoot across the sky as part of the Draconid meteor shower. They are so luminous they feel only an arms-length away. Feathers escape our down coats as we press ever closer to one another, buying time against the cold of early October. We leave only when the chill forces us to our tents.

The nineteenth century astronomer Maria Mitchell once said, "Mingle the starlight with your lives, and you won't be fretted by trifles." It certainly seems to work, and it's a good reminder to me to ditch Netflix and get myself out for a quick night dip in the lake before it gets too cold. Maybe the mink that hangs around the dock will slink by, hunting under the cover of darkness. Maybe I'll hear the hoot of the great-horned owl that nests just beyond the adjacent beach. Maybe I'll see you there.

For a truly local twist, ask for a "Black & Blue" - a pint of the Babe Blueberry Vanilla Ale with the 6060 Stout layered on top. The seasonal menu serves up substantial, upscale pub style meals. Enjoy a cocktail on the fully-licensed ridge or patio that overlooks the Athabasca River and Signal Mountain.



The family owned and operated resort is one of the closest places visitors can stay to the Miette Hot Springs (the manager's grandfather used to ride his horse from a nearby town to the original soaking pools). This hotel opened its doors in 1925, before a road had even connected Jasper to the outside world. At a time when rail or trail were the only ways to get to town, a young Greek immigrant named Paul Andrew was providing shelter and food to travellers who much like today's visitors - weren't afraid to leave the beaten path. Nearly a century later, the Andrew family still owns and operates The Astoria Hotel.



Over the past four generations much has been modernized - the rooms, the services, the two fantastic on-site restaurants - but one thing has stayed much the same: the Astoria has served as a basecamp for adventure. The walls of the De'd Dog Bar and Grill next door are a testament to the skiers and mountaineers who've had a connection to the Andrew family and Jasper community through the years. Relics include retro ski lift T-bars, a historical timeline of ski boots, and at least one photograph of a local powder hound in their underwear.

Hotel manager Oliver Andrew recollects how he was on skis with his dad (and current hotel owner) George Andrew at four years old. Each of his siblings have also skied competitively. This is a family that lives to ski.

It's easy to create your own Andrew family-style tradition at the Astoria. In winter, a ski shuttle will take quests straight to Marmot Basin ski resort and ski storage will keep gear safe while vou're not using it. A nearby shop even offers ski rental discounts to quests of the Astoria. In summer, enjoy hiking, guided fishing trips, biking and more.

After a full day of exploring, complete the Astoria tradition with some après ski bevvies with a bunch of locals at the De'd Dog. Then sleep comfortably in a mountain view room and get ready to do it all over again.



ne billion years ago, the mountains that make up Jasper National Park did not exist. The land was flat and covered by an inland sea. But massive tectonic pressure eventually built up within the Earth, pushing the fund upward into a jagged new form. Glaciers and rivers further polished the mountains to what we see today. Mount Glumbia is the highest peak in Alberta, a 3,747 metres. It towers over the Glumbia leefield and makes up part of the continental divide. Here, three watersheds meet and eventually drain into each ocean that surrounds Canada

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
